

## WE LISTEN FOR THE WORD

### SCRIPTURE LESSON

*1 Corinthians 12:3b-13*

No one can say “Jesus is Lord” except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

- **Big Band Music On The Patio:** On Saturday, June 17, *The Thursday Morning Little Big Band* returns for a concert of old favorites and new discoveries drawn from the American Songbook. The free concert begins at 4:00 p.m. on the patio in front of the church and is this month's Third@First offering. Bring friends!
- **Father's Day/Farewell Concert:** The Sounds of the Risen Son Youth Choir will present their tour concert following worship on Sunday, June 18 at 11:30 a.m. in the Chapel. This one-hour program is an opportunity for our youth to say "thanks" to all who have helped make possible their tour to Washington D.C. the following week, June 19-25.
- **Youth Visit Nation's Capital:** The Sounds of the Risen Son Youth Choir will be visiting Washington DC and the surrounding area this month, June 19-25. While in the District, the youth will present concerts for a United Methodist congregation and in a UM-related retirement community and on June 25 they will participate in worship at the Centenary United Methodist Church in Shady Side, Maryland - near the Chesapeake Bay.
